



QST REVIEW **By Jim Ward, W9DHX**

UNUSUAL MS CHALLENGE WALK GETS GREAT TURNOUT ON CAPE COD

Mark Richards, K1MGY, gives a great three-page report of a very intensive fund raising walk with 750 participants and 200 volunteers. Starting on page 72, Mark details the activities, planning, and special equipment prepared for conducting a charity public service event. Unique to this event was the use of bicycle mobile equipment that carried first aid equipment and other supplies right along the trail with the walkers and wheel chair participants.

DXPEDITION BY DUTCH HAMS SUPPORT MERCY SHIP'S CONGO MISSION

One way to find a site for a DXpedition is to make a connection with a Hospital ship that is located in a far distant land. Arie Kleingeld, PA3A, gives us a first person report of a 20 hour flight from Rotterdam to the Republic of Congo to go aboard the charity hospital ship Africa Mercy. A week of volunteer work on the ship put the ship's GPS network for their patient pickup vehicles in shape. With that task done, the team of four hams set out to have some DX time in the nearby jungle area. The four-page story begins on page 69. In the 11 days of operating, they had 30,000 contacts, using the call TN2MS.

THE DAWN OF SINGLE SIDEBAND - AND THE STORY OF THE DRAKE MODEL 1-A

Ken Pollack, K2RP, the editor of the Vintage Radio Column starting on page 95, explains in detail this month how SSB got started between the 1950's and 1960's. Hams today take this mode for granted, but SSB didn't happen overnight. Today's popular phone technique had blossomed in the late 40's with struggling homebrew SSB transmitters going on the air. QST published a column called "On the Air with Single Sideband". Even more amazing was the fact that no major manufacturers jumped at the chance to produce SSB transmitters and receivers! Central Electronics was first, soon followed by the ham radio giant Hallicrafters. Collins Radio came on the scene with their classic KWM-1 and KWM-2. Collins also pioneered the radical idea of combining the transmitter and receiver into a single device, the transceiver. Then came the low cost Drake 1-A Receiver advertised in December 1957 QST for only \$259. Read the rest in the actual issue!


