







WCRA Minutes from the November 1, 2002 Meeting

Steve announced that the business meeting will be brief so that we can begin tonight's program, the auction. January's program will be the Hamfest by Bruce, K9OZ.

Treasurer, Kim, N9XE reported on the club's financial position. Custodian, Roberto, WA9E, reported that the truck was at JOTA and that it has a brake problem, possibly the master cylinder. It offers simplex and semi-duplex modes and operates in the USB, LSB, ISB, CW and AM modes. Filter bandwidths are 2.4kHz, 1.8kHz, 500Hz and 6kHz for AM operation. 100 channels can be programmed into memory which lends itself nicely to the scanning of favorite frequencies. Power output is 100W PEP. Power requirements are 20-32VDC or 115/230VAC.

SYSTEM INCLUDES:

ST-3MR Antenna Matching Unit: select and manually tune among several antennas, including balanced and unbalanced lines (built-in balun), PR-8252 Receiver Pre-Amplifier, PS-7013 Power Supply: provides required voltage for operation of radio. Wired for 115V operation.

All parts are mounted in a small 19" rack. Legs have been added to the bottom of the rack to raise it to desk level. A microphone is included. Operating and service manuals included. Activities on the HF Bands by: Peter Barr W9UF

Jean Marc,F8IXZ will be in Senegal from December 14 to 22. He will be in the Djouj National Park, in the northern part of Senegal near the Mauritania border, and QRV as 6W4/F8IXZ. He will also spend a few days before and after in Dakar where he will operate as 6W1/F8IXZ. Equipment will include a FT-847 and a G5RV antenna for activity on 10 through 40 meters, mostly CW. QSL via F8IXZ.

Argentina's Bahia Blanca DX Group is activating Gama Island (SA-022) December 6-9. LW3DKC/D. LW4DRH/D, LW4DRV/D, LW8DMK/D, LW9EAG/D, LU4ETN/D, LU6EPR/D, LU6DRD/D, LU7DSY/D, LU8DWR/D, LU8EBK/D, LU8ECF/D, LU8EBJ/D, LU8EXN/D and LU9ESD/D will be on all bands. QSL via LY7DSY. For international return postage purposes, they

say it now costs \$1.25 U.S. to mail to the U.S. and \$1.40 U.S. to mail to anywhere else in the world.

Members of the International Amateur Radio Volunteers (IARV) are heading back to Western Africa. The IARV is a non-government organization and will once again be QRV from Mauritania and Western Africa in their spare time. The first stop will be from Mauritania between November 29 and December 7. Look for activity from 5T5PBV (JA1PBV), 5T5RUZ (JA8RUZ), 5T5RQ (JA6RQ) and 5T5CPS (JA1CPS). QSL via home calls. The group will also send a team into Western Sahara between December 2 and 5 and will be ORV as S07U. OSL via JA1UT. The group will consist of team leader JA1UT, JA1UPA (XYL), JA1PBV, JA8RUZ, JA1CPS and JA6RQ. They will put in a special effort of 160 and 30 meters.

ZS5WC, William, is now back in Khartoum, Sudan. He now has an IC-735 and a Hustler 4BTV. An amplifier was purchased however it was damaged in the shipping and is currently being repair by ZS4TX, Bernie. Once fixed Bernie will ship it to William. William will be traveling through Sudan over the next few weeks and may get on the air with a dipole until he gets back to his base in the capital city. Look for activity until at least Christmas. The Northern California DX Foundation (NCDXF) donated QSL cards. WD4NGB, Bruce, has set up a Web site for William at http://www.qsl.net/st0f/. QSL via ZS4TX.

Koichiro Takeda, JF1EQA is now working in Dhaka, Bangladesh and has recently obtained his S21YY license. Look for activity from him until 2004. Lately he has been found on 15 meters CW and RTTY. QSL via JF1EOA.

Roger, G3PVU is now active from Egypt as SU9VU. He is working in the Northern Sinai at El Gorah near El Arish. Roger will be active on 20 and 15 meters CW/SSB during his free time, but hours of activity will always depend on his work schedule. Roger was heard in mid November (as this is written) on 15 meter phone between 1Ø3Øz and 14ØØz, and on 20 meters 183Øz and 23ØØz. QSL via EA7FTR.

Base Esperanza, the Argentine research station in Antarctica, has resumed summer operations and club station LU1ZV is back on the air." Operations began in early November with Jorge (home call LU1ZF) at the mic. He is not fluent in English, but manages with QSO phases. Piloting the operation is Henry, LU4DXU, who took short lists for Jorge and translated as needed. Henry is also the QSL manager. Until mid-December, expect short unscheduled operations only due to Jorge's duties at the base. After that, Jorge and Henry will set up some schedules and take lists.

Should be easy to work Belize this winter. Joe, K8JPhas returned with his wife Beverly and will be there until April 2003. He will once again sign V31JP, and operate CW with some SSB and, maybe, RTTY. Operations will be on 160-6 meters. He plans on being active in the ARRL DX CW and SSB Contests as a SO/AB/HP entry and many other contests, as time permits. QSL via KA9WON with SAE and postage. Please visit the following Web page at: mywebpage.netscape.com/v31jp/homepage.html.

In addition, Jay, KØBCN/V31MX and Cal, V31MF will be on Caye Caulker (NA-Ø73) from December 11-17th. Activity will be on 20,15 and 10 meters. The will enter the 10 meter contest as V31MX with a Multi-Single station. QSL via KØBCN.

There is a new YL in Guyana. Bevon, 8R1YL, is reportedly the first national YL to be licensed in Guyana. She has been spotted as active on 12 meters in the afternoon. Gaynell, 8R1/KD4GMV (4/97) and Iris, W6QL/8R1 (12/81) are the only known YLs to have operated from Guyana in the past.

Joe, K8JP will be returning to Belize this November and hopes to be there from November 20, 2002 through April 2003. He will mainly operate CW with some SSB and maybe RTTY. Look for him on 6 through 160 meters. He plans on doing the ARRL DX CW & SSB and many other contests as time permits. QSL via KA9WON with SAE and postage.

QRZ DX reports that PY8IT, Tony, is once again heading to Fernando de Noronha. He is expected to be QRV mostly on the digital modes as PYØFT from December 8 to 10. QSL via JA1ELY.

The special callsign ZS6SOL will be on the air November 30-December 7 with a group of ZS5 and ZS6 hams operating. The operation notes a total eclipse of the sun that will be visible in the northern and northeastern parts of Limpopo Province, South Africa, December fourth. QSL via ZS5WI.

The Valencia County ARA will operate KC5OUR as a special Event from 14ØØz Dec. 18 through 23ØØz Dec. 26 celebrating Christmas from Bethlehem, NM. Suggested frequencies are 7.270, 14.270, 21.370 and 28.370. QSL with a SASE to: VCARA, PO Box 268, Peralta, NM 87042.

AI7MU will commemorate the attack on Pearl Harbor. The station will operate from the USS Arizona Memorial in Bullhead City, AZ. Scheduled operation is from Ø7ØØz Dec. 7 to 12ØØ Dec. 8, in the General Portion of 40, 20, 15 and 10 Meters. Either a Certificate or QSL is available with a SASE to Al Duaway, N7AD, HC34 Box 55, Williams, AZ 86046.

Mako, 7N2UTO has established a small search engine for DXers. The name of the site is called "THE DX RANKERS." The site is a collection of web sites, which are useful for Dxers and also a bulletin board that accepts image files and a reverse link ranking, too. You can visit his Web page at http://isweb31.infoseek.co.jp/sports/rankers/.

Steve, N4JQQ/C6AFP notes that the Bahamas QSL bureau has not been functioning for years with the Bahamas Amateur Radio Society dormant. Steve believes C6AFV, Delano, has all the cards that have accumulated in his possession in Freeport. So, if you want a QSL from the Bahamas, Steve says, QSL direct and/or via the home call if it's a visiting ham. If you work Steve himself when he's on as C6AFP, QSL to him at N4JQQ with the usual SASE or other return postage and you should be well taken care of.

The ARRL Letter reports the DXCC Branch is digging out of the September card submission rush, when half the year's cards are received. 240,000 QSL cards from 2,400 applicants were taken in. Wayne Mills, N7NG says new software will enable standings updates throughout the year, hopefully starting in 2003. Bill Moore, NC1L reports QSL cards for 7Z1AC from Saudi Arabia are now good for DXCC. There are several others from this part of the world that are still awaiting the needed approvals.

In a communications emergency, monitor W1AW for special bulletins as follows: Voice on the hour, Teleprinter at 15 minutes past the hour, and CW on the half-hour.

DX Potpourri

Monk Apollo, SV2ASP/A, is back in Mount Athos for the Fall/Winter season. He spent his summer gathering olives just over the border in Greece. Hopefully Apollo will be QRV in his spare time.

HL8KSJ has been on from the South Shetlands (VP8) from South Korea's King Sejong Station in

Antarctica. The operator is Oleg, UA1PBA.

Mel, JA2KLT has been working in Damascus, Syria since April of this year. He hopes to soon be QRV from the club station of YKØRJ. Apparently this is a donated station by the IARU, currently with no antennas. Once Mel gets on the air, QSLs will be handled by JA1ELY.

Well-known QSL manager Antoine, F6FNU reports that he was recently hospitalized. If you've send cards to him in the last 6 weeks please be patient as he recuperates and catches up.

Frank, 3A2MW can often be found putting Monaco on the air on 12 meter CW around 12ØØz. Because of the mountainous terrain, this can be a tough one to work.

EK8ZZ, operator Rodney, is active almost every night on the digital modes from Yerevan, Armenia. He usually operates RTTY, PSK31 and MT63 modes, between 21070-21085 and 14070-14085. Rodney is also known as KP4USA. EK8ZZ is the club station call there.

XT2ATI is operator Dani, EA4ATI. He will be in Burkina Faso the next six months. OSL direct only via EA4YK.

AC4G, Bruce, is planning to head back to the Marshall Islands. Look for him to be active as V73CW starting around the first week of December. QSL via AC4G.

Peter, VKØMQI is stationed on Macquarie Island until March 2003. About the only time to catch him is between Ø4ØØ and Ø6ØØz on Sundays on 21.365. His QSL's have already been approved for DXCC.

Joey, T9/W5BAK will be in Sarajevo, Bosnia-Herzegovina, December 17-23. It's possible he will be able to get a T98 callsign. He will be on in the evenings local time on 10, 15 and 20 SSB, PSK31 and RTTY. QSL via W5BAK.

VP5/W6XK and VP5/N6EE will be on from the VP5B contest station in the Turks & Caicos January 1-7 including the ARRL RTTY Roundup, when they will use the callsign VP5NN. Before and after the RTTY event, they will emphasize RTTY on all bands and CW and phone on the WARC and low bands. QSL via their home calls and QSL VP5NN via NN6NN. VP5B and at least two other VP5 stations were active in the CQWW SSB this weekend.

This field portable "kit" consists of 16 interlocking alloy sections, 12 guy ropes w/rings, 1 halyard, 1 counterpoise, 1 mast tip, 4 metal guy stakes (at least), one base plate, one base swivel stake, one isolator (insulator), and the carrier for transporting the kit. The mast is 45 feet high when completely assembled, and can withstand very high winds when correctly guyed. Excellent for hoisting dipoles and other wire-type antennas, for field day or otherwise.
