

WCRA Minutes from the March 7, 2003 Meeting

The business meeting was called to order at 19:35 by the President, Bob KE9A, and introductions were made by the board and all attendees. A motion was made to approve the minutes with one correction; the January minutes were not approved at the February meeting. The motion was seconded, a vote was taken and the motion was approved. Bob announced that other commitments make it necessary for him to resign. He will be able to serve until elections are held. The Vice-President, Steve,

N9OA, reported that this evenings program will be a video on how to build a tornado-safe room. Secretary, **Robert, N9EF**, reported that the number of paid-up members stands at 40, which will increase by the end of the meeting. Bob, KE9A, gave the Treasurers report, and that we were not required to file a tax return for last year. Bob also reported that we have a new registered agent who is an attorney. Custodian, Roberto, WA9E, reported that he is awaiting estimates to repair the truck. So fare the estimates range from \$1200 to \$5000. The bill for the 440 repeater was submitted to the insurance company. Hamfest, Mike, AB9AX, reported that they are looking into Hawthorne Racetrack for next year. Jack, KA9HEL, found an article about the Racetrack which may impact its availability. Mike will look into it. Elmer, George, KC9CG, reported that the Know Code class will be conducted 3/20 – 5/15 7-9PM at the Wheaton Police Dept. Public Service, **Joe**, **N9WRO**, reported that the MS Walk is on 4/6, the Special Olympics will be held on 4/27 in Naperville, the July 4th parade will be held as usual, and the Glendale Heights parade will be held on 8/23. Joe passed around sign-up sheets for these events. If you are interested please contact Joe, N9WRO. RAB, **Don, N9NYX**, reported that COD is still negotiating with cell companies and that the antennas will probably wait until the negotiations are completed. Don also reported that the Skywarn group may not be using the 200 repeater any longer. No decision has been make concerning the packet repeater. Training, Jack, KA9HEL, reported that the fee for the Tech class has been reduced to \$30 (it is reported as \$45 in the COD Quarterly). Jack also reported that we only need six students to hold a class, we previously needed none. Field Day, **Dale**, **NJ9E**, reported that it will be held in Panfish Park this year. Hamletter, Don, N9NYX, reported that the Hamletter has been emailed. So far Don has seen six returned emails. Bob, KE9A, reported that our 'print person' is no longer available. Bob and Don are exploring other possibilities.. If you have a new email address please give it to Don, N9NYX, or Robert, N9EF. New Business: The Nominating committee, Bruce, K9OZ, Ken, K9HQ, and John, WT9Y, provided nominations for the various offices. Mike, AB9AX, has been nominated for President. Japanese operator Toshiyuki "Tosy" Moriyama, JA6VZB is heading to Palau to celebrate his 20th wedding anniversary (talk about having your priorities straight). He was active from there in 1997 as KC6SZ mostly on 160 meters and will do it again this time as T88JA. He hopes to be QRV from the beach on Peleliu Island from March 19 to 22. Tosy thinks there will be less QRN as compared to with Koror, the main island. The rig is an ICOM IC-756Pro and a JRL-2000F amplifier running 1,200 watts input. Antenna will be an inverted L on the beach. He will only be QRV on 160 meters. QSL via JA6VZB, Toshiyuki Moriyama, 10-101 Karakuen, 5-53-62 Hanazono, Kumamoto-city 860-0072, JAPAN.

Hiro, JA1CQT will be back in Kabul, Afghanistan in mid April. He has twice submitted documentation for YA1BV, YA1CQ and YA1JA to the DXCC Desk. Hiro also submitted another document, which amends the effective license date up to March 31, 2003. The Ministry of Communication, Afghanistan is preparing new radio regulations, so he has applied again for amateur radio licenses according to the new regulations, which will take place in the near future. Hiro's colleague Masami,JM1CAZ is in Kabul now and he can operate the club station YA1JA. He does not like pileups.

Saad, N5FF plans to visit and operate from Syria (YK) again this month. His current and tentative plan is to head for Damascus on Friday April 11, arriving in the oldest city in the world on Sunday April 13. A simple setup of a bare foot rig and G5RV will be used. Saad expects to be QRV as YK1BA around April 15 to 27. Amateur Radio is not the main reason for this trip; however he hopes to put in at least 3-4 hours a day. He'll have access to 10-40 meters but will probably concentrate on 20 meters. Saad will be looking for the Americas and Pacific in his early mornings (Ø1ØØ-Ø4ØØz) and Europe and Africa in his late evenings (19ØØ-22ØØz). He may be on during his afternoons (11ØØ-14ØØz). Look for him around 14.195 on SSB and 14.045 on CW, split listening 5-10 KHz up. QSL via N5FF.

Look for David, F5THR (ex. 6W1AE, T99CCD, TL8CD, J28EX) to be active from the Ivory Coast as TU5CD until July 1. QSL via F8BON.

Last month's Ducie Island DXpedition will come to an end Thursday March 13th around sunrise their time. There were rumblings of a European lead DXpedition to Ducie this month, however that operation has been postponed due to personal reasons by several of the ops. The team is looking at going later this year, possibly this fall.

Bernard, F5LBG is active through April 13 from Martinique Island. He will be signing as FM/F5LBG on 6 through 80 meters CW. QSL via the bureau or direct to Dauvier Bernard, 20 chemin des Mottes, F26760 Beaumont, Les Valence, France.

Dr. Keith Kerr, GM4YXI just arrived back in West Malaysia, and will try to activate various islands. Firm plans thus far include AS-046, Pulau Tioman, with 9M2/G4ZFE. QSL 9M2/GM4YXI via N3SL, 9M2/G4ZFE via G4ZFE. They are planning on operating from club station 9M2RPN for the WPX. No QSL info at this time on that call. Keith emails logs almost daily to N3SL, so QSLs should be available immediately.

Members of the Korea AnSung DX Club plan to operate special call D70HL/2 from April 4 to 6. They will be ORV on 10-80 meters CW, SSB and RTTY. OSL via the bureau.

DL4KQ has returned back to Myanmar (Burma) for a planned operation until April 17. He has operating permission and plans to use the callsign XY4KQ, 160-10 CW and SSB with a 4KW amp, except for 160, to a G5RV and a vertical. He may try to get on from an "Islands on the Air" spot also, the Mon Region Group (AS-

NEW).

Bruce, AC4G has had to postpone his plans to operate from Wake Island, KH9. The runway is being rehabbed. He now hopes to get there in August or September, though if not, it will mean another postponement. Meantime, N4BQW/KH9, Chuck, may be active from time to time from Wake. He goes to Wake to handle medical emergencies and routine medical checkups for personnel there. When AC4G gets there, he is expected to do his own OSLing, since that's what he's done for past operations.

We may see more activity from Tanzania, 5H, soon as it was just announced that a new entry-level novice license has been made available. It has reduced requirements, reduced frequencies and reduced power. The basic license is no code but allows code operation on the air as a stepping-stone to full privileges. Ralph, 5H3RK says he's proud that Tanzania may have "an unprecedented critical mass of indigenous radio amateurs."

Jose, the last operator at LU1ZA on South Orkney, had some trouble with his Morse code key so he didn't do much CW towards the end of his rotation there, at the end, though he did, and RTTY too, before that. Henry, LU4DXU now has the logs. He hopes the new operator, Anibal, will do more CW. He has a new TNC, the AEA 2232 and Henry thinks Anibal will be active on RTTY as well. Jose did his last transmitting February 28th. QSL LU1ZA via LU2CN.

Bjorn "Hugo" Ark, LA5YJ, is once again active as 9N7YJ from Nepal after a two week break to his home QTH. Hugo's length of stay in Kathmandu is unknown at this time (possibly through December). He is there on a mission for the U.N. Hugo has a better rig with him this time. He used a Kenwood TS-50 previously and is now working with a Yaesu FT897 w/CW Collinsfilter, and 100 watts. He also has trap dipoles made by Rag, LA6FJA, for several bands now. This will allow him to be active on 160 through 12 meters. He plans to be active on 160 meters during the weekends. He is not active on PSK31 or RTTY, however someone has been pirating his call on the Digital modes. Look for him on 10.103 on various times throughout the day (between 123Ø and 183Øz; even as late as Ø3ØØz), 7.003 kHz at 16ØØz and 3503 kHz between 23ØØ-Ø1ØØz. Hugo will try to get access to a linear which may be available later. No QSLs via the bureau. QSL only direct with 2 US dollars or valid IRCs to: Bjorn Hugo Ark, Rute 504- Paulsrud, NO-2840 Reinsvoll, NORWAY. PLEASE NOTE: Hugo will not answer any QSL requests until he returns home. He has answered some QSL requests (for his activity between November 2002 and February 10th) when he was home during his two week break.

Tom, VK3ZZ; Peter, VK3QI; Keith, VK3FT and Jack, VK3WWW will activate Waldegrave Island East (OC-New) (part of the South Australia State West Centre Group) from April 17-22nd. They will be using the special callsign of VI5WCP to celebrate the historical naming of the island by Mathew Flinders during his coastal exploration of March 1802. A special commemorative QSL card will be prepared to celebrate this historical event. Activity will be on all bands except 160, both Phone and CW. QSL will be direct to VK3ZZ: P.O. Box 368, Leongatha, Victoria 3953, Australia, with a self-addressed envelope plus sufficient return postage, or, via the bureau. Direct QSL cards not conforming to the above will be returned via the bureau.

The Aland Islands, OHØ, will be put on the air by a number of German Ops April 19-25th. Operators Claus, DF8QJ; Marvin, DL2VB, Mike, DK6QW and Reinhard, DL6YFB will be active as OHØ/home call. Activity will be on 80-10 meters including the WARC bands on CW/SSB/RTTY. QSL via their homecalls.

The "World Amateur Radio Day (WARD) 2003 Award" is devoted to commemorate the World Amateur Radio Day celebrated by the IARU on April 18th each year. The theme for the 2003 WARD is "Amateur Radio Supporting Technology Education in the Classroom". It is issued by the MK QTC – Polish Amateur's Radio Journal with PZK (Polish Amateur Radio Union) support. The WARD Award is available for at least the following number of contacts: 10 QSOs on HF bands or 5 QSOs on VHF bands. All contacts must be made on April 18th between ØØØ and 24ØØz. A standard application form including the list of QSOs should be sent before May 31, 2003 to: Redakcja MK QTC, ul. Wielmozy 5b, 82-337 Suchacz-Zamek, Poland. The price of the WARD Award is \$5. This is a full color award, sized 210 x 297mm. Any questions can be sent to: qtc@post.pl

A group of seven Italian Hams are headed for the Marquesas Islands later this month. The group will be QRV from April 25 to May 9. Team members will include I2YSB, IK2DIA, IK2GNW, I2MOV, IK2WXV, IK1AOD, and IK1PMR. They will have three stations on HF and one on 6 meters. Plans are to have a beacon on 50.105, which will be active every hour and every half hour for 5 minutes. The call sign is still not known. QSL via I2YSB either direct or via the bureau. There are two addresses that can be used. They are: Silvano Borsa, P.O. Box 45, 27036 Mortara (PV) Italy or Silvano Borsa, Viale Capettini 1, 27036 Mortara (PV) Italy. They also have a Web page at http://digilander.libero.it/i2ysb/marquesas/marq.htm.

Hrane, YT1AD will be going with a team to Western Sahara this month. No call was mentioned but they will be QRV on 2 through 160 meters on CW, SSB and RTTY from April 16 to 22. They will have three radios and two amplifiers. Team members will include YT1AD, N6TQS, KD7RCD, EA5JJ and several other EA ops. QSL via YT1AD.

Richard G4ZFE is currently in West Malaysia. He recently operated from AS-074 and AS-046 on February 22/23 and March 1/2. Richard plans to operate from AS-058 later this year. The QSL route for his 9M2/G4ZFE 9M2/G4ZFE/P and 3W2ER operations is via the bureau to G4ZFE or direct to Richard Everitt, #2601, PNB Darby Park Jalan Binjai, Kuala Lumpur 50450, Malaysia. Please note that he only collects his QSLs from the UK once a year, but all bureau cards are QSLed 100%.

There is erroneous information being circulated that the KH6 bureau was handling cards for American Samoa, Wake Island, and Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands (KH8, KH9 and KHØ). This information is incorrect so do not send QSLs for anything but Hawaii to the KH6 bureau.

The ARRL and the IARU are gearing up for the WRC-03 meeting in Geneva. One of the biggest topics on the table for Amateur Radio operators is the proposed realignment of the 40 meter band. Check out the ARRL Web site for complete details at: http://www.arrl.org/news/stories/2003/03/06/100/?nc=1.

The ARRL has posted the DXCC 2002 Annual List on their Web page. This is normally listed first in the DXCC Year book. Toping the mixed list were K6ZO, W2AGW (SK) and W2BXA with an amazing 391 countries. The top leaders from other continents were KH6CD (388) from Oceania, 4X4DK (386) from Asia, DJ2BW (384) from Europe, PY4OD (378) from South America and ZS6YQ (372) from Africa. On SSB it was W2BXA with 389, CW was OZ1LO with 358, on RTTY it was I5FLN with 343 and on Satellite the top DXer was DC8TS with 261. On the individual bands it was W8LRL (309) on 160 meters, ON4UN (352) had 80 meters, W8AH (362) on 40 meters, 4X4DK (384) on 20 meters, N4MM (333) on 17 meters, W4DR (359)on 15 meters, W1JR (330) on 12 meters, K2FL (353) on 10 meters, SV1DH (215) on 6 meters and SM7BAE (133) on 2 meters. No mention of 30 meters because it was not added as a single DXCC award until October 1, 2002. Victor, ZK1CG from the South Cook Islands often calls and listens for Generals on 3.852 but usually no one listens to him since there is so much chatter there! He prefers Ø6ØØ-Ø8ØØ and later 11ØØ-14ØØ UTC if he can't sleep well.
