FCC DROPS MORSE TESTING REQUIREMENT

For some, the removal of the "code" requirement is a disaster; for others, it opens a door to one of the most fascinating communication techniques in the spectrum. Rick Lindquist, N1RL, reports in detail on page 79. The FCC had the official line--"This change eliminates an unnecessary regulatory burden..." Testing for licenses will continue, but there will be no code requirements. A "Q&A" page (80) will give you the answers to common questions, such as "Do I have to pass a Morse Code test to use CW on the air?" The answer is "No. Any Amateur Radio licensee who wishes may use Morse code on the amateur frequencies they're authorized to use -- except the USB-only channels at 5MHz."
