Thinking about putting up a new or used tower?

The following article appeared in the infohams digest in response to a question regarding taking down and putting up a used tower. It contains some words of wisdom. Submitted by Wayne, KB6CSP.

Joe

Used towers are extremely dangerous to work with unless you know exactly what you are doing. Rohn and other tower manufacturers strongly recommend the use of professional tower personnel in dealing with them as well as erecting new towers. The reason used towers are available "standing" at a good price is that the cost of disassembling a tower properly and safely is often a substantial portion of the cost of a new tower. The cost of a new tower is only 40-50% of the total cost if it is erected properly! I have a friend that had a 5KW wind driven generator atop a 80 foot Rohn tower - it was struck by lightning fusing the generator. He wanted to get rid of it and thought the tower might be worth something. The generator weighs over a ton thus requiring a crane to take it down (cost minimum \$250 to get the crane to the site, another \$250 maybe to get the generator and tower on the ground). Then, after spending this much money, the tower sections could be welded together by the lightning strike requiring a cutting torch to separate them. What is




Larry, WA9RTE, writes one the "10 best" Stories in My Best Eyeball QSO Contest

ALL-NIGHTERS WITH 'QBB

Tasker and I became very good friends, and I learned that he was the first violinist of the Wayne King Orchestra, which was playing at one of the suburban shopping centers. He and the band were staying at a downtown motel. Many times over the years he ended up going back to the apartment where my wife and I lived and stayed up most of the night talking about his life. He would talk about the days when he played in Las Vegas and his friend-ship with Howard Hughes and flying with Mr. Hughes at the wee hours of the morning in an airplane with some starlets, including Betty Grable on one occasion. He also claimed to have invented the inverted "V" antenna.
