

Tom N9WBW motioned to adjourn, Marty N9NTM seconded, the motion passed, and the meeting was adjourned at 2130.




SOME HISTORY TO SEE THIS COMING FRIDAY EVENING

Here are some comments, directions, and pictures of the site for this coming weekend's Camporall from Peter, N9HDW:

I inspected our exhibit site today and have attached a drawing (not to scale) showing the measurements of key landmarks: power pole and 5 trees. The trees are ~60 feet high Shagbark Hickory's. The farthest distance between a pair is 108 feet and the closest is 7 feet. If each station operator could bring a 100 foot power cord, we should be able to position all the stations within reach of the power pole which has eight 20A 110 VAC circuits (4 of which are assigned to WCRA).

Please remember to bring some sort of open air shelter (dining tarp, patio umbrella, screen gazebo) to provide some shade for you as an operator, and potentially some rain protection.

We spread the stations around our exhibit area which is approximately 100 ft square so that visitors can gather around multiple stations simultaneously.

Bob Schlotzer, NV9R, has agreed to come out Saturday 7 AM, 5/5/07, to help string dipoles into the trees. He requests that you bring long enough quality string to get your feed rope started. String can be purchased at Menards. Recommended #18 white 75 lb tensile strength. You would want at least 150 ft to shoot up into a 60 ft tree.

Also, Travel directions from Wheaton to the Sandwich Fairgrounds are attached.

I will send additional pictures of the site by separate email following this note, but a picture of the northeast tree group and the southeast lone tree are attached.

Thanks to all for your willingness to share our hobby with the scouts! :-)

NOTE: Please enter through the HORSE GATE on the SOUTH side of the Fair Grounds. DO NOT enter through the North Gate off Pratt Road.

- 1. Turn LEFT (East) onto W Park Ave 0.1 mi
- 2. Turn LEFT (North) onto Warrenville Rd [S West St] < 0.1 mi
- 3. Turn RIGHT (East) onto SR-38 [W Roosevelt Rd] 0.5 mi
- 4. Turn RIGHT (South) onto [Winfield Rd] NOTE: NAPERVILLE ROAD ENTRANCE TO I-88 IS CLOSED FOR CONSTRUCTION 5.7 mi
- 5. Turn RIGHT (West) onto Ramp towards I-88 / East-West Tollway / Aurora 0.5 mi
- 6. *Toll road* Merge onto I-88 [Ronald Reagan Memorial Tollway] 13.4 mi
- 7. Keep RIGHT onto SR-56 towards IL-56 / IL-47 / US-30 / Sugar Grove 4.1 mi
- 8. Road name changes to US-30 [SR-56] 2.4 mi
- 9. Turn LEFT (South) onto Dugan Rd (TRAFFIC LIGHT, then cross RR tracks), then immediately turn

RIGHT (West) onto Granart Rd 3.0 mi


- Bear LEFT (South) onto CR-35 [Granart Rd] 10. 2.6 mi
- 11. Bear RIGHT (West) onto CR-9 [Galena Rd] 1.7 mi
- 12. Road name changes to Chicago Rd 2.5 mi
- 13. Turn LEFT (South) onto CR-10 [Somonauk Rd]
- Turn LEFT (East) onto CR-11 [Suydam Rd] 1.5 mi 14.
- 15. Turn LEFT into HORSE GATE into Sandwich Fair Grounds.
- Arrive 1401 Suydam Rd, Sandwich, IL 60548-1458 End.
