BLACKWELL FOREST PRESERVE

NORTH SHELTER AREA, OVERLOOKING SILVER LAKE, WARRENVILLE, IL

Food served at 6 pm, followed by a FOX HUNT

Entrance: On the North side of Butterfield Road, about 1/4 mile west of Winfield Road. The area is about 0.8 miles after entering. Follow the main road ahead and slightly to the right. Pass the Boat Rental area on the right. You will pass Mount Hoy on the left. Pass the West Sector Maintenance Center on the left. Keep going and look for a Campgrounds sign on the right. Turn in there, and almost immediately turn right again and you will see the North Shelter bathrooms and picnic benches on the left. They are on a slight hill overlooking the lake - a very scenic location.

Note this is different from last year, when we were at Herrick Lake.

The shelter area has electricity. Bathrooms are close by. (Continued on page 5)
