Salutations, WCRA members and friends:


Spring is in the air, so is Summer, Fall and even some Winter! That said, a new year in WCRA is upon us ... Happy New Year.

History of WLS AM890 by Scott Childers W9CHI

Scott has been an amateur operator since he was 13, originally licensed as WD9FXP. In the late 1980's, he produced and hosted the CSRA-1 and ChicagoLink information nets.

Scott was born and raised in Chicago, and has reported traffic and news at several different radio and television stations around metro Chicago, including WBBM-AM, WMAQ-AM, WBBM-FM (B-96), WLS-AM and WGN-AM. Scott was also an on-air personality at WWBZ-FM, WXLC-FM (Hot 102.3), WTMX-FM (The Mix) and WPNT-FM (FM-100) and WERV-FM "95. 9 The River." He was also Assistant Program Director and Imaging Director for WERV-FM. He recently moved over to WSSR-FM "Star 96.7" in 2009 where he hosts afternoons, and is the webmaster and IT Director, for WJOL-AM's websites.

He has written the book titled "Chicago's WLS Radio 1924-2007," which hit store shelves in October 2008. He is also a freelance voice-over talent, whose work can be heard on everything from radio and television commercials to corporate telephone on-hold messages.

Scott will have his book available for purchase at the meeting.
