WCRA PRODUCES ANOTHER "WOULDN'T MISS IT" HAMFEST 2011

John Faber, his committee, and many volunteer workers, turned out a great performance at the Kane County Prairie Events Center on January 23. The months of preparation by all concerned, paid off big in attendance and enthusiasm. Vendors and visitors alike were pleased with the cleaned parking lots and cleanliness of the facility that made for convenience and safety.

One of the stars of the show was the "CSU—Communication Support Unit". The gleaming trailer, freshly loaded with the latest in radio equipment, was parked inside and caught the attention of newcomers and veterans alike.

Among the first visitors was Joe Pritchard, RACES official, who also made at presentation at the first Seminar of the day at 8:30. (See separate story about RACES elsewhere in the issue).

Technical Editor of QST, Joel Hallas,W1ZR, ran the second Seminar on Antennas, and followed with Seminar No.3, using the "Questions and Answers" technique from his "THE DOCTOR IS IN" featured column in the national magazine.

A variety of merchandise and services were available at the 150 plus tables carefully lined up on the main floor. From the vintage "swap meet" style items to the latest sophisticated electronic items, there was something for everyone—including a computer driven embroidery sewing machine for personalized caps and shirts.. Vendors were quick to offer advice on selective problems and hard to find items. Sales were reported up from previous years, and they were ready to be back in 2012.

The Grand Prize of \$200 was won by Phil VanHeurek, W9XAN, of Elgin, Illinois. He was a Bears fan and was not present to collect his cash, which he received by mail. 
