
Friends:







Pioneer WCRA member and Illinois Aviation Hall of Fame inductee, Bill Coons died on March 23rd. He will be missed by many members of the ham radio and aviation community. Bill had his Extra Class ticket, was a volunteer examiner and worked at many jobs in the Club.

He was the proud owner of one of the controversial Ercoupe planes, dedicated to the cause of Aviation Safety, and one of the moving forces behind the DuPage Airport Air Show. A resident of

Lombard, he was a regular attendee of the Club Breakfast that was held weekly in the 70's.

Memorial Services will be held on Sunday, April 10th, at 1:30p.m. in the Mukenschnabl Hangar at

DuPage County Airport. The hangar is located on the south side of North Avenue near Powis Road. The hangar will be decorated with balloons. Parking can be entered from Powis Road and North Avenue.

Hi Everyone

My name is Victor Carter, K9WXV. I am a candidate for Vice President of WCRA, and would like to introduce myself to all WCRA club members. I believe serving as a club officer would allow me to give back to WCRA in return for the fun I have had as a WCRA member.

I started in Ham Radio on 8/26/2000, earning my Tech license as KB9WXV, upgraded to Extra on 4/4/2007, and received my vanity call, K9WXV, on 3/31/2009. In 2003, I joined WCRA and attended the

club's Field Day in June. It was my first field day as a ham; I made 12 contacts on 15 meters and was hooked on Amateur Radio. As a member WCRA, I really enjoy volunteering for the club's public service events, working on the CCU team during parades, MS Special Olympics, and hamfest.

As a ham I operate mostly mobile operations because when I was working I had a long compute to work. After retiring I am working on my hamshack at home. My primary radios included an Yeasu FT-897 hf/2m/440 base, Kenwood D700 2m/440 mobile, and Kenwood TS-480 hf mobile. I enjoy operating on the WCRA CCU team, 2m/440/220 FM on Chicagoland repeaters, APRS, 40m ssb, and Skywarn spotting when the weather is bad. I live in Bellwood, Ill on the Cook/Dupage county border and can operate on repeaters in both counties. I am a strong supporter of ham radios operators helping out the community in times of disasters. As a ham I have volunteered in an ARES national disaster training exercise while I was working in Washington DC. and worked on the 2-day Wisconsin MS bikeride in 2009.

In May 2007, I retired after 33 years of service with the federal government. My career included 12 years with the U.S. Postal Service, as an mail processing equipment automation mechanic/electronic systems technician. And 21 years with the Federal Aviation Admin. as an NAS electronic systems technician/manager in Chicago, specializing in terminal radar, communications, and operations. I am proud to be a veteran of Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm in 1991, after serving 11 years in the Illinois Air National Guard, 126 Air Refueling Wing at Chicago O'Hare as an Avionics technician on KC-135 refueling tankers attaining the rank of TSgt (E-6).

In 2009, I returned to Moraine Valley Community College to pursue my associate degree in Cisco Information Technology and CCNA certifications, and I currently hold A+ Hardware/Software and Network + computer certifications.

If I am elected I would like to encourage members of WCRA to put together a mobile communications go kit to be used for community emergencies, using 2m mobile radios and battery power for longer range communications. I have some examples to show to the club. I would like to setup some mobile vhf/uhf/6m simplex nets for a couple of hours one day to experiment for club members to try. Overall I think WCRA is a good strong club and would like to continue the current club traditions.

QST-Apr.2011-It's World Amateur Radio Day

APRIL 18-- THE THEME "Amateur Radio: The first technological-based social network." That is explained on page 8 by David Sumner, K1ZZ, CEO of the ARRL. He feels the Hams were way ahead of the current techies who put together the Internet and cites the history of early amateur radio and the operators "relay" mission. Thus the "relay" in ARRL. Dave presents a bit of history and an introduction to the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU), which is a recognized telecommunication organization. It was founded on April 18th, 1925.

VINTAGE RADIO—THE LAFAYETTE RADIO FACTORY—A glimpse back in time for the photos and narrative on a tour of the company's 1930s factory in the heart of New York. Their modestly priced PB46A Phone and CW transmitter was set up in a three deck "mini rack" that appeared in many shacks from coast-to-coast. The article is by Columnist John Dilkes, K2TQN and appears on Pages 94 and 95.

DXers TAKE NOTE! There's a new country in the making. The Republic of Sudan (ST) is made up of Arabs and Nubians in the north and Christians and Animist Nilotes in the south. A new country is being carved out of the extreme Southern portion. You can read all about it on Page 87 in Bernie McClenny's column.

FIELD DAY IS COMING—two helpful ideas for antenna enhancement in this month's issue are suggested. First, on pages 38 to 40, you'll find a great idea for ground radials. Use steel measuring tapes—they can be adjusted to frequency needs and are inexpensive. A second idea, in case you can't find a bow and arrow archer, make a giant sling shot. HELP ON YOUR SIGNAL REPORTS—Taking the RST report format seriously can be done if you read this month's "Can you read me now?" article on Page 68 by Steve Andrea, AG1YK. He includes a chart of the three elements (Readability, Signal Strength, and Tone—cw only) and how to attach a number to each letter.

ARISSat-1 DEPLOYMENT DELAYED—Remember Kevin's reference to the new Amateur Radio Satellite that was rocketed out in space on January 28th? The dramatic video on his program during the March meeting was great Ham Radio in action. The deployment delay was reported on Page 76 under "In Brief". A photo shows it being tested last September at the Johnson Space Center.
