QST REVIEW FOR APRIL 2012-TITANIC STORIES FROM DIFFERENT VIEWPOINTS

April 14th is the 100th anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic, so you'll be hearing many a story about the heroism of those who were rescued and those who might have been rescued. Two of the major stories of this issue are devoted to this event, leading off with Radio's Role in the Titanic Disaster on pages 30 and 31. The detailed story was furnished by the Steamship Historical Society, a group of Maritime enthusiasts. Another story is told on page 93 about Harold Cottam, the wireless operator on the Carpathia. His ship was 58 miles away from the Titanic when the unsinkable ship plowed into an iceberg. The only operator on the Carpathia, Harold took one "last sweep of the dial" and heard the distress ... --- ... call that led the Carpathia to change course and rescue 712 survivors. John Dilks, Editor of the Vintage Radio column is the author of the second story.

DX-PEDITION IN THE WATERS OF ANTARCTICA – THE ORKNEY ISLANDS

You've read many an article about DXpeditions in faraway places, but this one is among the wilder ones. Taking off from southern Argentina, a hearty multi-national crew set up their station on Signy Island in the South Orkneys. You'll enjoy the complex equipment roster and adventures with adverse weather (high winds, icebergs, and rough seas) and an unbelievable expense budget of one-third of a million dollars! Add to that five weeks of time from the hams as well as \$15,000 of personal funds. It is on pages 66 to 69. Note: Financing .VP8ORK, appears on pages 86 and 87, telling how they raised all that money.

ADAPTIVE MOBILE OPERATIONS – CUTTING HOLES IN YOUR CAR OR SUV

Chris Blake, NX4N, tells a personal story of how he set out to create an "ultimate" mobile station, using his Suburban SUV as a basic building block, with an 18 x 24 hardened aluminum plate as an antenna mount on the roof. Add-ons are explained on four pages starting on page 34.

FCC STAFFER TELLS ROLE AS EMERGENCY COORDINATOR FOR ARES/RACES

Curt Bartholomew, N3GQ, senior emergency and continuity manager in the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau at the FCC, spoke recently at the ARRL/TAPR conference. His remarks spoke to the issue of ARES/RACES and county officials. He cited his own experience as an emergency coordinator (EC/RO) for his home county; by getting to know and working well with county officials, he was able to gain significant placement of amateur assets on county towers and property with no fees and grow his capability accordingly. He was also able to recruit many new ARES/RACES members as a result of the enhanced footprint of Amateur Radio in the county. Good relationships with the local fire chief, sheriff, and emergency manager are thesaid. Rick Palm, K1CE, wrote the report in the public service column on page 81.

WATCH OUT FOR SPAM MESSAGES THAT ARE HOOKED TO YOUR CALL SIGN

Hams that have their calls incorporated in their e-mail addresses have reported to ARRL headquarters that they have received bogus e-mails, notifying them of a bill that supposedly needs to be paid. The e-mail instructs the reader to click on a link to view the bill. Clicking on the link could release a virus that can infect your computer.

Please be aware that these e-mails are not coming from the ARRL.

"If you receive an e-mail like this and it looks like it originated from the ARRL, please do not respond," explained ARRL IT Manqager Michael Keane, K1MK. "The best thing you can do when receiving bogus e-mails is to simply add them to your spam list in your computer e-mail program and delete it. Please don't forward it to ARRL HQ—we will have already seen it and are already responding to it."
