QST IS ITS OWN COVER STORY!

Pictured on this month's cover is a laptop screen loaded with the printed issue's headlines. When you reach page 13 you'll read the Publisher's story of the two years of preparations. The details of how it will be phased in can be found further in on page 74.

QST Management views the "on line" digital edition as one of two new benefits of ARRL membership. The other benefit is a member's ability to access archived issues of QST from December 1915 to the present.

OPTING OUT OF THE PRINT ISSUE

ARRL members can choose to opt out of the mailed, print edition of QST at any time by completing the on line "opt out" form. It takes a while, so you could receive at least one "unwanted" printed issue. Choosing to opt out of the print issue is voluntary and will not result in a refund or reduction in ARRL membership dues. Any savings by not sending the print issue will be used to extend the League's public service activities. It will be interesting to see the statistics on: (1) Number of new memberships resulting from the Digital edition. (2) Number of opt out requests. (3) Number of hits on the Digital Edition.

FIELD DAY IDEAS - TRY 50 Mhz plus

Sean Kutzko, KX9X, contributed a timely article this month on Field Day. A rule change last year allows any class A or F station a "free" VHF station—one that does not change their transmitter count(www.arrl.org/field-day). He wants you to take advantage of a high hill and a temporary mast, such as a painter's pole. The photo on page 70 shows you just how to do it.

MORE "EASY TO SET UP" ANTENNA IDEAS
