CLUB REPEATER NEWS!!!

By now, most of you know that the WCRA 2-meter repeater was damaged by a lightning strike on July 17th. The lightning hit across the street from Carol's house and tripped about half of the circuit breakers in her breaker panel. After resetting all the breakers, the repeater came up stuck on transmit, and the initial ID was scrambled. We pulled the external controller, switched the repeater to its internal controller, and for a week it worked fine except for lack of an ID. Unfortunately, when the power to the repeater was turned off and back on, the internal controller failed as well, and the repeater was taken off the air for repairs.

A temporary repeater was put on the air August 5th, consisting of 2 of my personal Bendix-King commercial VHF radios and a very basic controller, and has been operating since, with very good results.

Troubleshooting of the external controller revealed 2 damaged IC's which were responsible for passing the control signals between the repeater and the controller, as well as some scrambled programming of the ID's. The IC's were replaced and the ID's reprogrammed, and the controller now seems to be fine. Troubleshooting the repeater itself has proved a little more difficult, as it was modified to accommodate dual-subtone decoding, and I do not have the documentation of the modifications. I have narrowed the problem down to the circuit board responsible for the actual keying of the transmitter, as well as the timing functions of the repeater.

It is entirely possible that, even if the repeater is repaired, other failures may continue to pop up: this is very common with lightning damage. I will be asking the Executive Board to look into our ARRL insurance coverage to determine whether the repeater would qualify for replacement under our policy.
