



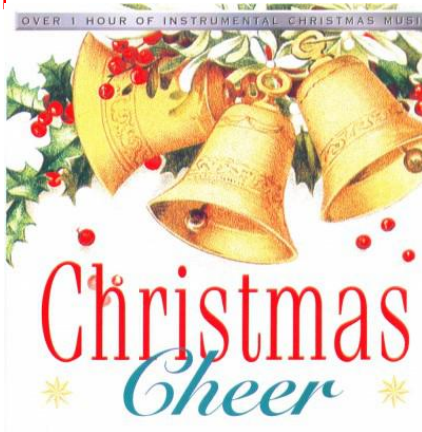

UP UP AND AWAY, CLUB MEMBER DARRYL HEDGES (KD9AUK) HELPS NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY COMPLETE SUCCESSFUL BALLOON LAUNCH!!

I'm proud to announce that the High Altitude Balloon Group from Northwestern University that I have been coaching this Fall successfully launched and recovered their first HAB mission on Saturday, November 22nd, 2014.

We launched the balloon from Koerner Aviation in Kankakee, Illinois at 10:25 am (in some light rain). The launch went without a hitch and the balloon (a Kaymont 1500 gram high altitude weather balloon carrying a single payload package containing three GoPro cameras, a miniature flight computer, an APRS tracker, and a SPOT Generation 3 GPS tracker) climbed steadily until it burst at 98,800 feet.

From launch to recovery the balloon and payload package traveled about 111 miles in a relatively straight line from Kankakee Airport to just east of Warsaw, Indiana, where it narrowly missed landing in a large lake, and came to rest just several hundred yards beyond the lake. Our Recovery Team found the balloon and payload intact shortly after it landed.

If you would like to see the track that the balloon followed, go to the "APRS.fi" web site and use the call sign KD9AUK-4. Set the "Show Last" time on the right side of the screen to show any flights during the last 7 days. Set the "Track Tail Length" for the same period.

The final landing spot was just east of Big Chapman Lake near Warsaw, Indiana. Use the "+" and "-" buttons located in the upper left-hand corner of the screen to zoom-in on the landing location. Also, click on the "Map" tab at the top of the screen and scroll down to "Satellite" to set the screen to show the "satellite" view on the map. You'll be able to see some amazing detail of the area. If you click on any of the tiny red dots that appear along the balloon track, an information box will appear showing the telemetry information that we were receiving as we tracked the balloon while sitting in a McDonalds in Matteson, Illinois.

Our two-man "Recovery Team" had already driven to the predicted landing area in Indiana earlier in the day. Most, but not all, McDonalds restaurants have a WiFi connection to the Internet.

The Byonics APRS tracker performed flawlessly.

The initial review of the payload indicates that the three (3) GoPro cameras we were using to record the mission performed flawlessly and recorded the entire mission from launch to landing. One camera was pointed up to catch the balloon burst, one was pointed down at about a 45 degree angle to the ground, and one pointed straight out at the horizon. Initial indications are that the videos were "awesome".

While passing through the Jetstream, the balloon and payload were traveling well over 100 miles per hour. I'll pass along more information when the flight computer data is fully reviewed. I'll also pass along any images once I receive a copy.

Now that the cornfields in northern Indiana have been harvested, and those 8-foot tall corn stalks are no longer a barrier, I will be launching my own high altitude balloon missions in early December and through until late June. If you would like to help out, I can always use an extra pair of hands or energetic people to help with the launch or chase to recover the balloon.

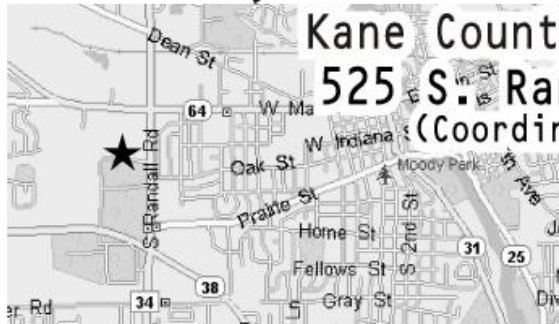
