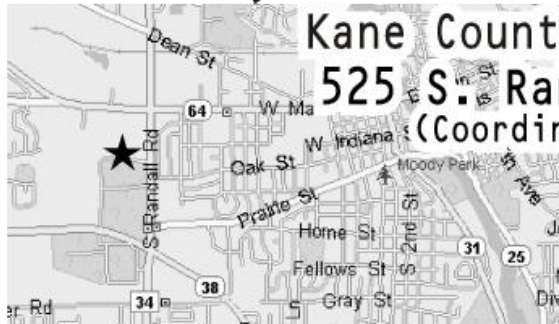

Forum Information

9:30 – 10:15 AM Forum #1: Ham Radio and High Altitude Ballooning

Darryl Hedges KD9AUK will discuss the use of Ham radio and APRS in particular in the exciting hobby of High Altitude Ballooning (HAB). Ham radio clubs and schools (elementary through college) are using HAB as a way of educating students about Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) - four pillars of our modern manufacturing and high-tech society. There will be equipment displays and video clips showing groups (including recent KD9AUK HAB missions) launching and chasing their HAB mission payloads as they ascend to the upper atmosphere (80,000 to 115,000 feet) and then parachute back to ground with on-board video cameras, flight computers, and radio tracking systems. Maybe you'll decide to give Darryl a helping hand at one of his next balloon launches!

10:30 - 11:15 AM Forum #2: Broadband Over Ham RF Links - Hamnet Meshed Network

Is it possible for ham radio operators to have a broadband wireless network for the transmission of voice, video, and data as a backup, to the Internet and the commercial infrastructures, that we depend upon? Jim Kinter, K5KTF, is doing that! He is the chief evangelist for the Broadband Hamnet (BBHN) group in Austin, Texas. (Broadband is defined as greater than 1 megabit per second data rate.)

BBHN is a project wherein Hams use commercial off-the-shelf routers, install custom software developed by Hams for Hams, for broadband-speed digital uses. BBHN opens up a whole new world for Ham radio, allowing applications impossible with older technology.

Covered topics include: necessary gear, getting started, deployment of a meshed net in your area, benefits, permanent installations with links 9 miles and longer, public service uses, and more. Jim K5KTF will be leading the forum remotely via Skype from Texas. www.broadband-hamnet.org

11:30 AM – 12:15 PM Forum #3: Practical Safety Considerations for Amateur Radio Towers

Mark Allen, W6PC, (VP - Rohn Tower Products) highlights problems and risks associated with continuing operation, erection, maintenance and dismantling of amateur radio towers and structures that support antennas. Many structures are 30 or more years old. Common problems, modes of failure, preventive maintenance and related topics will be covered. The presenter is a well-known industry expert on commercial and amateur towers and is employed in an executive capacity with ROHN, an industry icon, designing and building towers for nearly 70 years. Presentation is approximately 45 minutes in length and will be followed by an interactive question and answer session, time permitting.

ANOTHER CENTENNIAL-100 YEARS OF QST MAGAZINE TO BE CELEBRATED

No sooner had the organization started—"We need a magazine!" Thus QST came about and each month in 2015 an article will be selected to appear. This month it is about World War II. A copy of "Order 87" dated Dec. 8th, 1941 was reproduced. The order suspended all amateur radio operations. Under a separate article, it was announced that the Army Signal Corps was looking for radio operators, and a radio license presented to a Recruiting Officer would be automatically mean acceptance for radio work. Four pages of the wartime issue are reproduced on pages 76-79.

Silent Key-Eugene "Mac" McAleer W9MAC

May 11th, 1925- December 17th 2014.

Shown here is Silent Key Eugene (Mac) McAleer, who was president of the WCRA during earlier years, and also was the net controller of the "Teletype Net". The Net was conducted between club hams, each of whom had their own teletype machine. The net followed the regular Sunday night net on two meters. Gene learned to fly during World War II, finishing his B-29 training just as the war ended. He continued his aviation career as a commercial airline pilot. He also flew for the Illinois National Guard and was ordered to active duty during the Cuban missile crisis. In addition to his radio hobby, Gene was an active model railroader. Gene was the beloved husband of Elizabeth Lyttle, loving father of Russell (Alexis) and Michael (Kristen) McAleer and John and Patricia. He was also the cherished grandfather of Kayla and fond brother of George (Betty) McAleer.



WCRA Participates on ARRL “Centennial QSO Party”

Contest Station WB9Z
December 5th found Peter N9HDW, Greg WA9SGF, and Mark W9UZ on their way, foggy and early, to Crescent City, IL. The day was considerably brightened after a brief stop at Dunkin Donuts. The purpose of the visit was to operate W1AW/9 during the 100th



anniversary year of the ARRL HQ station W1AW. Each ARRL region gets to use the W1AW/0 up to /9 call for 2 weeks. This was one day out of one of those weeks. Each band, 160, 80, 40, 30, 20, 17, 15, 12 and 10 has four types of operation - Phone, CW, RTTY and PSK 31. Operating times are two hours each operating for 24 hours per day. The purpose is to spread the word about ARRL - and to make as many contacts as possible.

On December 5, we operated two time slots - 10 AM to noon and noon to 2 PM. Jerry Rosalius, WB9Z has a world class station. He lives on a farm originally owned by his grandparents near Crescent City, which is about two hours south of Kankakee, IL. Since his company installs, maintains and rents space on them, he is well qualified to use and maintain his 10 - yes - 10 towers on his property. The highest one is about 400 feet. Others range from 100 to 400 feet. The 195 foot tower even has a rotating base, made by K0XG. While ordinary people think of 10' Rohn tower sections as vertical structures, Jerry uses them as his booms - the horizontal antenna support system! Not just one beam on 20 meters - but multiple beams stacked and phased on 20! See his website at QRZ.com. Most of the antennas are "home brew" including a 3 element 80 meter beam and a 4 element full size 40 meter beam.

Virtually every station we called, including many in Europe, answered us on our first call, typically giving us a 5 - 9 signal report, strengthened by a 20 over 9 addition. It was great being on the reverse end of the "pile up". We stayed on frequency while all calling stations came to our frequency. Commemorative QSL cards will be sent to all stations contacted.

We are indeed fortunate having a professional Videographer in the club. Peter and Mark will make a presentation to the club in February.

WCRA Participates on ARRL “Centennial QSO Party”

The ARRL Centennial QSO Party was a year-long operating event that celebrates hams making contacts. In the end you will have accumulated points, worked new stations and made new friends all over the world.

The Centennial QSO Party is made-up of two main activities: (1) W1AW operating portable in each state and most territories; and (2) The Centennial Points Challenge which is the accumulation of points from qualifying contacts made throughout 2014.”

On December 8th 2014 2 WCRA members, Mark Potter (W9UZ) and Greg Schmit (WA9SGF), operating as W1AW/9 from Joe’s (N9WRO) Ham Shack on 20M CW and Phone had a crack at the QSO party. They were running about 600W from my FT-2000 into a Cushcraft R7. Band conditions were, to be polite, crappy but fun was had. I had a lot of fun the prior day making contacts on 20M all over the country and got the HF bug again, but unfortunately Monday the band was down for most of the operating time. The good news is that both Mark and Greg got some good “fist” time in.
